CRIMINAL JUSTICE CENTER RENOVATION



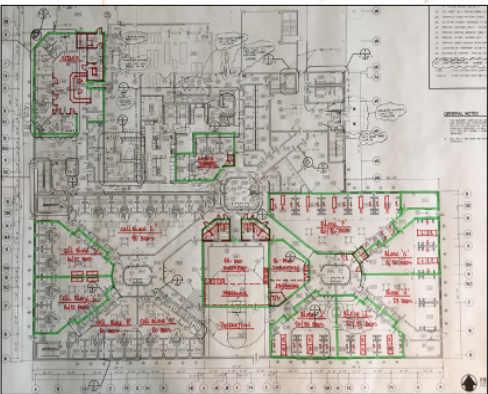
The Floyd County Criminal Justice Center was in need of significant mechanical and electrical upgrades after 20 years of use. The jail was continuously running at or over capacity and the Intake and booking, medical, and storage areas needed expansion. Since replacement of the existing facility was not economically feasible, expanding bed capacity became a priority.

PROJECT APPROACH

- A design study was conducted by Securitecture to determine the existing facility's compliance with the State Jail Standards and if an internal capacity increase was possible for this landlocked facility.
- Securitecture performed a detailed analysis of the square footage areas for all Inmate housing cell blocks and dormitories, Intake and booking, and inmate program areas.
- The state of Indiana Jail Inspectors were brought into the study process to confirm Securitecture's approach and final recommendations.

RESULT

- Over 100 beds were added to the capacity of the existing facility without adding any square footage to the building.
- The Intake and booking area was re-configured, capacity was increased and padded cells were added.
- Kitchen and Laundry area capacities were improved.
- Some underutilized Inmate program areas were converted to housing units.
- Underutilized outdoor recreation area was converted to indoor/outdoor recreation.
- All detention doors, hardware and security electronics were completely replaced and upgraded.
- The useful life expectancy of this critical facility was extended by at least 20 years with this under \$15,000,000 renovation.
